

JOHNSON COUNTY JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE

Participation Sheet

2021 Important Dates

- **Beef Weigh-Ins/Tagging** – January 10, 2021
- **Sheep/Goat/Swine Tagging** – May 15th at the Johnson County Fairgrounds-Buffalo
- **Fair Entries** – Due July 16, 2021 - ShoWorks online
- **Johnson County Fair** – July 30 – August 8, 2021

The Johnson County Sale Committee will charge an 8% commission on all market animals selling at the Johnson County Junior Livestock Sale on August 7, 2021. However, as a consideration of services in kind, anyone attending and participating in the Junior Livestock Sale Meeting and following requirements will have that commission reduced to 2%.

Participation Requirements:

1. Attend the online Junior Livestock Sale Meeting.
2. Personally deliver the buyer brochure to the assigned businesses. Youth cannot substitute the assigned business for another business. Youth is encouraged to visit any other business(es) he/she wishes.
3. Youth must complete the online test by June 15, 2021. The youth must return the signed participation form by August 5th, to receive compensation and have their commission reduced from 8% to 2%. Mail or drop off the following items found in your packet to the Fair Board Office on or before August 5, 2021.
 - a. Enclose a current business card from each of your assigned businesses. **Make sure you write your name on the back of the card so we can give you credit.**
 - b. If the business doesn't have a business card, please have them write their address, both physical and mailing, and a contact person and phone number on the *Sale Registration Form* enclosed in your packet. **Write your name on the back of this form.**
 - c. If they are no longer in business, write the business' name and that they are no longer in business on the index card. **Write your name on the back of the index card.**
 - d. If the business does not wish to be further contacted by the Junior Livestock Sale Committee, please write that along with the business name. Write your name on the back of the index card.
4. Attend the mandatory livestock meeting on Monday August 2nd at 7:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds.

Sale Information

- Youth will be allowed to sell one market animal (provided that the animal meets the weight requirements) that they had shown at the Fair this year.
- The Youth are required to lead their own animal through the sale ring. If a case arises where the youth is unable to do so, these extenuating circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the Livestock Committee.
- Youth and their parent or guardian will be required to sign a Livestock Owner's Certificate located on the Livestock Consignment Card. The certificate states that to the best of their knowledge, the animal being sold has not been fed any protein derived from ruminant tissue and will not have an illegal level of drug residue. Certificate will need to be turned in to the Extension Office at the Fairgrounds immediately following the respective species show. A sale animal failing a blood test will nullify the sale.

- Junior Livestock Sale Committee will handle the following details:
 - o Health Inspections, Brand Inspections, Collect Sale Receipts and make payments to sellers.
- Payments to youth will be made after all sale receipts are collected. Checks will be released to youth after the youth has turned in handwritten (stamped) thank you for all buyers, to the **Fair Board Office**.
- A complete listing of rules and regulations for the Junior Livestock Sales can be found in the Johnson County Junior Livestock Show Rules Book.
- All exhibitors that plan to sell an animal **must turn in a Junior Livestock Consignment Card**. This paper tells the sale committee which species and which animal you plan to sell. **It has to be turned in within (one) 1 hour after the show of whichever species you plan to sell.** Forms will be available at the announcers stand during and after each show.

The Livestock Committee has the final ruling in all matters.
